#### **RESEARCH INTERESTS**

My research focuses on determinants of nicotine, tobacco and other substance use in youth and young adults. As a community psychologist and bio-behavioral epidemiologist, I am primarily interested in the etiology of these behaviors with the goal of identifying modifiable risk factors that can be used to inform the development of prevention programs. To this end, I have examined psychosocial influences, gene-environment interactions, and social contextual factors to identify social cognitions from the users' perspectives that increase or decrease risk for nicotine/tobacco and other substance use.

Currently, much of my research focuses on mental health, peer and family functioning, and acculturation as they relate to nicotine/tobacco and cannabis use. Social media use among youth and young adults also is a risk factors for both nicotine/tobacco use as well as poor mental health outcomes. Furthermore, media use, including social media, is central to the acculturation process as it reflects language skills, information-seeking options, and opportunities for social interaction. I am interested in how social media use (a social contextual factor) influences modifiable risk factors (psychosocial influences), to in turn influence vaping behavior, and how acculturation might exacerbate this relationship among Mexican American college students. In addition, I am interested in the interactions between symptoms of depression and anxiety with action-oriented traits, such as impulsivity and sensation seeking, to better understand the role of vaping both nicotine and cannabis on suicidal ideation in youth and young adults as well as suicidal behaviors in the veteran population.
