

Course Registration

Searching for courses in [myUTH](#) will give you the most up-to-date information. Use the [myUTH Student Guide](#) for assistance navigating through the myUTH search process.

When registering for coursework, students should select the appropriate course prefix and section number. All courses are graduate level courses. Some courses are offered as either master-level or doctoral-level. In those cases, doctoral students should select the doctoral-level offering. Students at any campus can register for web-based online courses. Students should also seek advice from their faculty advisor and refer to their degree planner when selecting coursework.

For permission codes, please use the Permission Code Portal by selecting the 'Request Permission Code' button for an individual course on the [interactive class schedule](#). Prior to enrolling in any independent study, practicum, thesis or dissertation course, students need to verify their degree requirements and discuss the number of credits they plan to take with their advisor.
